#### **INVESTMENT POLICY OF THE FUND**

We launched the AEGON Asia Equity Fund of Funds so that our customers could profit from the Asian growth. The persistent profit growth of Asian companies, the regions richness in liquidity and the appreciation of the Asian currencies are the key to the strong economic growth of the region. a growth that will probably be much higher in the years to come than the European or American one. According to our opinion the long-term structural development secures the sustainable above-average growth. Dissimilar to the previous economic cycles, the region is less vulnerable because of its big foreign-exchange holdings and low indebtedness. The developing internal demand and high liquidity could compensate a potential slowdown in the American economy. Most of the Asian equities offer high dividend yields and the valuation level of the companies is low compared with other regions. Certainly it is important to invest in such markets that have adequate valuation levels. Our investment decisions are supported by a special investmentplanning model, which builds on all the important macro economical indicators and the companies' evaluation indicators, 75% MSCI AC Far East ex Japan + 15% MSCI India + 10% ZMAX Index is the composite benchmark index of the Fund. The Fund's main goal is to overperform its benchmark by a minimum of 2%.

#### **MARKET SUMMARY**


As the MSCI World Index rallied 1.5% in January, developed markets outperformed emerging markets which is not usually the case in a rising market. Of the major regions of the world, Europe (+3.8%) performed best last month followed by the USA (+2.3%). Emerging Markets (-2.8%), Asia Pac ex-Japan (-1.4%) and Japan (+0.1%) all underperformed the World Index. After good start of the year the political crisis in Egypt brought in some jitters for equities, which turned out to be short-lived. Brent crude surged past the key level of USD 100/bbl for the first time in 2 years. In current economic cycle, in short term Asian equities are not the best performers since rising inflation outlook (being commodity exporter economies and having heavy food weighted consumer price indices) may trigger local central banks for further interest rate hikes, while the growth outlook, which has been still the engine of the global economy, are priced in equity prices. The fund underperformed its benchmark by 94 bps in January.
