During the 1st half of the month the Wig20 index rose about 13%, but the worldwide sentiment changed and the market went down again, and fell by 19% and finally it went up by 12% till the end of the month. The AEGON Bessa gained 1.68% from the previous month, and the 1 year performance of the Fund is almost 16%!
