INVESTMENT POLICY OF THE FUND

According to the purpose of the fund manager, the Fund mainly invests in government debt securities of OECD countries. By paying maximum attention to legal compliance, it keeps a minimum of 15% of the portfolio in liquid assets. Besides the legal regulations the fund manager focuses on safety and the principles of ultimate diversification. On the grounds of this investment policy the fund is only allowed to buy publicly issued, investment-grade, listed securities.

MARKET SUMMARY

The main topic of the international bond markets was the uncertainty of given answer to the accelerating inflation recent months. The political and military crisis in the Arabian world and the Japanese earthquake increase the risk aversion in the world, which can support bonds of developed countries temporarily. From the big, developed economies, the ECB was the first who shows the first sign of the rate-hiking will on the back of the accelerating inflation. The FED waits with the rate-hiking sounds temporarily and don't want to react too early without a clear evidence of a durable commodity inflation pressure. We keep our neutral position against our benchmark.

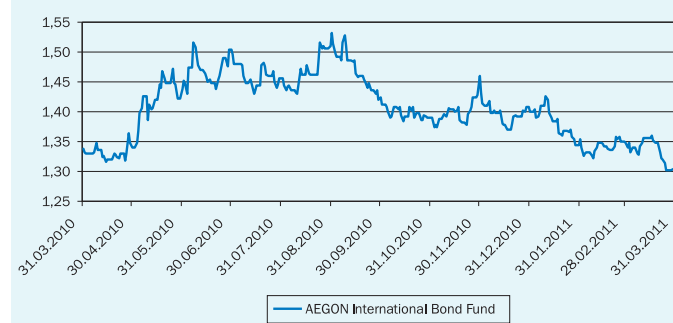
