INVESTMENT POLICY OF THE FUND:

The fund's investment objective is to provide investors with a higher return than that attainable in the domestic money market, primarily by investing in the bond market of the Central and Eastern European region. The fund's bond investments are mainly concentrated in the corporate and mortgage bond markets, but government securities issued in foreign currency are also potential investment targets. Forint-denominated Hungarian government securities are only held for liquidity management purposes. The fund may also buy into other investment funds that invest in the above markets. The achievement of a higher return than would be attainable in the Hungarian government securities market is made possible by the better diversification, the additional yield from the premiums of the bonds, and, in a favourable market environment, by the price gains resulting from the narrowing of the premiums. The fund's general risk level and the asset allocation between the three main areas of investment is determined on the basis of a regular market analysis and situational analysis relating to four main aspects (fundamentals, valuation levels, market sentiment, technical factors). The in-depth analysis is also an important factor in the selection of the individual securities by region, sector and interest risk. In the course of selecting the individual securities, a thorough financial analysis is also essential to determine the creditworthiness of the issuer. Risk management and the regular monitoring of the issuers are of key importance to the fund. When compiling the fund's portfolio we aim to achieve a moderate risk profile, primarily purchasing investment-grade securities. The fund only buys lower-rated instruments in limited proportions. The fund may only conclude derivative transactions for the purpose of hedging or ensuring an efficient portfolio structure. The fund may also hold unleveraged collective investments linked to derivative indexes. The fund also has the option of taking on a substantial currency exposure, which will ordinarily be fully hedged, although depending on market circumstances the fund may even have an open currency position. The fund management company, exercising all due care, based on its own judgement and decisions, and while observing the relevant legal provisions and the limitations stipulated in the Fund Documentation, determines the means of utilising the fund's resources, and the weights of the various investments within the portfolio, with a view to ensuring that the fund - in line with our expectations with regard to future risks and returns - achieves its objective in the long term

October will go down in history as a month of great turbulence and negative returns. Sentiment around the risk assets deteriorated sharply as October started as market approached the US quarterly reports. Investors were first clearing postitions before the event which translated into a sharp downturn in US assets and during the publication of the reports as guidances were quite pessimistic this negative sentiment culminated. The risk off sentiment of course reached EM assets as well, however bonds performed relatively better which means in this environment a smaller negative return. The overall EMsovereign bonds' yield spread widened by 30 basispoints. Perfomances in the EMEurope region were mixed. Due to the deterioration in sentiment high beta names like Ukraine and Azerbaijan were underperformers, but Turkish sovereign bonds managed to outperform the region as investors started pricing in the positive developments around the country. We bought some Hungarian USD papers and participated in the new Ukraine issuance




