### INVESTMENT POLICY OF THE FUND:

The fund aims to share in the yields of the Turkish equity market, and to profit from Turkey's economic growth through share price gains and dividend income. Given the risk profiles of the equity investments, the fund is classified as a high-risk investment. The fund manager's intentions are that the fund's portfolio should consist predominantly of the publicly traded shares of foreign-domiciled companies. The primary investment targets are the stock exchange-traded shares of companies that maintain an active presence in Turkey, or that generate a substantial proportion of their revenues in the Turkish market. When building the fund's portfolio, beyond the minimum statutory requirements, the principles of safety and maximum diversification (the spreading of risk) are observed. The fund management company, exercising all due care, determines the means of utilising the fund's resources on the basis of its own judgement and decisions, while observing the relevant legal provisions and the limitations stipulated in the Fund Documentation and by taking into account the macroeconomic environment of the investment markets, relying primarily on fundamental analysis. When compiling the portfolio, it is shares that determine the nature of the fund, and thus the proportion of shares that may be held in the fund at any given moment may reach the prevailing statutory maximum. When determining the weights, within the equity investments, of shares traded in the Turkish market, we aim to ensure that the fund - in line with our expectations with regard to future risks and yields - achieves its objective, which is to outperform the benchmark advertised by the fund, over the longer term. The fund records its assets in forint; the fund management company may, at its own discretion, choose to hedge all or a part of its currency risks with forward currency positions, in compliance with the applicable statutory requirements. Under the current legislation the proportion of shares in the portfolio may be up to 100%.

### MARKET SUMMARY:

In April, systematic vaccination against Covid-19 continued in the developed world. Vaccine companies have started to ramp up vaccine production, so it is probably safe to say that by the end of May or early June, those in the developed world who ask for the vaccine will get it. The most spectacular progress has been made in the United States, where more than 35% of the population has already been vaccinated, and since mid-April there have been no restrictions on vaccination, so anyone of any age can get the vaccine. In Europe, vaccine availability varies by country. In Hungary, everyone who has applied can now get the vaccine, while in Germany the same is expected by the end of June. If the vaccination schedule continues at this rate, there is a chance for the developed world to see a "normal" summer season unfold. The the major indices hit new all-time highs, thanks to the lower US yields. At the moment there is a so-called "goldie lock" scenario, which means that interest rates are higher than before but not high enough to hurt stock markets and at the same time the economy is growing. Economic forecasts remain positive and although there is already a noticeable inflation in the economy, but not high enough to cause serious damage to companies. There is finally some good news about the corona virus in Hungary. Although the mortality rate is still very high, one of the worst in the world on a population basis, but the vaccination rate is one of the best. The government has ordered a reduction in restrictions, and restaurants have been allowed to open, albeit with some restrictions. This positive change is reflected in the forint exchange rate. It moved in a relatively narrow range, closing the month near the 360 level. The fund posted a negative return in April and slightly underperformed its benchmark. Political tensions in Turkey have not yet subsided after the Turkish president replaced the head of the central bank in March. Although the new leadership has not cut the interest rates, we believe that the foreign exchange risk remains present in Turkish investments. The April inflation numbers were as expected, so we believe the central bank will cut rates as soon as possible. In light of this, we have underweighted the bank sector against the benchmark. We continue to favor sectors that could benefit from the European reopening, such as the tourism. The steel sector is also overweight, but we are trying to buy companies that peg their prices to foreign currencies so they are not hurt by the rising inflation. The agricultural sector is also overweight, although we took some profits in that sector last month. The fund is about 3% overweight against the benchmark.

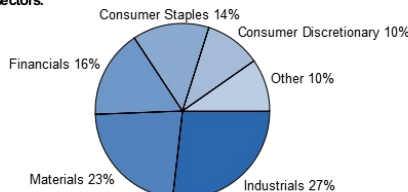
