# Aegon Smart Money Fund of Funds







#### INVESTMENT POLICY OF THE FUND

The Fund's objective is to establish a portfolio for its Investors that generates positive returns – higher than the yields available on the domestic money market – under all circumstances, i.e. the Fund pursues a "total return" strategy. The Fund seeks to achieve this goal by selecting, through various analytical techniques, the asset classes and investment funds that have the greatest price growth potential and make investments through the purchase of investment units and collective investment securities. The Fund invests primarily in investment funds managed by Aegon Magyarország Befektetési Alapkezelő Zrt., but may also purchase other investment funds and collective investment securities in its portfolio for diversification purposes or if the given asset class is not yet covered by the Fund Manager's funds. In order to ensure liquidity, the Fund may hold in its portfolio discount treasury bills and government bonds issued by the Government Debt Management Agency (ÁKK), interest-bearing securities guaranteed by the Hungarian State, and bonds issued by the MNB. As the range of possible investments includes investments denominated in foreign currency, ETFs and investment units, the Fund's investors may also bear some foreign exchange risk. According to the Fund's investment policy, it invests or may invest more than 80 percent of its assets in investment units or other securities issued by a collective investment undertaking. However, the Fund does not intend to hold more than 20% weight in any one investment fund, except for the Aegon Money Market Fund, Aegon Domestic Bond Fund, Aegon Panoráma Derivative Fund and Aegon Ázon Maraton Active Mixed Fund, Aegon Panoráma Derivative Fund and Aegon ÓzonMaxx Absolute Return Fund, the weight of which may be as much as 100% within the Fund's portfolio.

#### **MARKET SUMMARY**

Although the war between Russia and Ukraine is still ongoing, the investment world is much more concerned about inflation and how central banks will respond to it. Inflation around the world is at multi-decade highs. In the Eurozone it is at levels that is similar the early 2000s, in the US it is at a 40-year high, while Hungary has also not seen such high inflation for more than 20 years. The question on everyone's mind is what central banks will do to curb inflation, and whether they can do anything at all.

In March, the US Federal Reserve raised the Fed Funds rate by 25 basis points, which seems ridiculous in the face of inflation of almost 9%. The Fed is not in an easy position. If it raises rates too high, it could very easily create a recession, but if it raises them by only 25-50 basis points, it could be too slow and inflation could rise further. Let's not forget that over the past decade, the US national debt has more than doubled and a sustained rise in interest rates would be disastrous for the US economy. Europe is not better off. Since the 2008-2009 crisis, the ECB's main task has been to support the bond markets of the South-European countries by continuously buying them. If the ECB also raises interest rates, it will hit the South-European countries very badly, and some of them could enter into bankruptcy. The MNB continued to raise interest rates in April in response to high inflation figures. In April, the MNB raised the base rate by 100 basis points to 5.40% and the one-week deposit rate to 6.45%. The EURHUF exchange rate was highly volatile in April due to the Russian-Ukrainian conflict. During the month, the forint weakened from 367 to 377 against the euro. Currently, higher interest rates are unable to strengthen the Hungarian currency.

The fund posted a negative return in April. Of the fund's investments, only the Panorama fund managed to increase its value, benefiting from the negative duration and the commodity exposures. In contrast, Alfa, Maraton and Moneymaxx suffered losses after a very weak month for both bond and equity markets. This year the bond and equity markets had their worst start in 40 years.


